# Free Planting & Litter Picking 2022

Throughout the months of April and May, Holland-Bukit Panjang Town celebrated SG Clean Day 2022 with tree planting and litter picking events to encourage greater personal responsibility in keeping our estates clean and green. This annual event has become even more significant over the years as we work to mitigate the effects of climate change. Residents who participated in the tree planting events shared that they were happy to contribute to enhancing their neighbourhoods.

"I am pleased that we are doing our part to future generations amid many challenges to our environment," said Mr Rajeev, who was present at the Bukit Timah tree planting event with his two kids and witnessed the planting of 20 young saplings at Block 316 Clementi Avenue 4.

More importantly, tree planting events are avenues for children to learn about the importance of green practices, and being hands-on always makes for a better learning experience.

As part of Zhenghua division's tree planting day, Greenridge Primary School

students joined Zhenghua
Greenridge Residents'
Committee volunteers
in planting 10 Golden
Gardenia tree saplings
at Block 505 Jelapang
Road. The enthusiastic
students later went
to pick litter around
the estate as part of the
litter picking event aimed
at reinforcing the importance of
keeping our estates clean.

On the other side of Holland-Bukit Panjang town, Bukit Timah division carried out its monthly "Bin It" event in celebration of SG Clean Day 2022. Residents retrieved tongs and trashbags from the 'Cleanpod' (a shed containing reusable equipment for clean-ups) before roaming Clementi Ridges & Firefly Park in search of litter that morning.

On 29 April 2022, Mr Liang Eng Hwa, Member of Parliament for Bukit Panjang Constituency and Chairman of Holland-Bukit Panjang Town Council, joined students from Zhenghua Primary school at Block 234 Bukit Panjang Ring Road to distribute care packs to migrant workers from the Bukit Panjang, Cashew and Zhenghua divisions.

The event was initiated by Mrs Constance Loke, Principal of Zhenghua Primary School as part of their Values-In-Action project. Adhya Jain, a student from Zhenghua Primary

School, shared that he and his schoolmates spent a week collecting donations for the care packs, including canned food, snacks, and other daily necessities. They also checked the expiry dates of the donated food and wrote cards for the migrant workers.

The community hall was filled with anticipation as the students spoke to and even played games with the migrant workers. Mr Naim, one of the migrant workers from Bukit Panjang division, expressed his happiness at getting to talk to the students and being appreciated for his work.

Zhenghua division held a separate appreciation day on 20 May 2022 in conjunction with Hari Raya Puasa, where 30 cleaners were thanked with a special Hari Raya goodie bag and nasi briyani meal.

Although most of these workers present during the event may be far from their families having to be here in Singapore, such timely gestures remind them that they are not merely workers, but a part of our community as well.

You too can show your appreciation for migrant workers by taking responsibility for your living spaces so as to reduce the cleaners' workload. You can also share a simple greeting and smile whenever you see them around the estate!

"Every morning, migrant workers wake up very early to clean the corridors and lifts, and with the COVID-19 situation, they have to do some sanitisation of our areas as well. A lot is being done and it may not be so visible to everyone. I'm happy the students have an opportunity to appreciate our workers."

## Together, We've Saved 30 Trees...

... and counting! Since the launch of the SGRecycle stations across Holland-Bukit Timah GRC & Bukit Panjang SMC in January 2022, residents have stepped up and collectively recycled over 1,738kg of paper — equivalent to the saving of 30 trees — in just three months!

Deployed islandwide as part of the PAP Action for Green Towns initiative, the machines have been massively popular because it collects waste paper in exchange for incentives. Plus, they are conveniently placed around Holland-Bukit Panjang Town so residents never have to go far to recycle.

### Little Garden, Big Difference

Bukit Panjang Butterfly Garden bags their second GOLD at the Community in Bloom (CIB) 2021 Awards by the National Parks Board.

Three years after winning their first gold award in 2018, Bukit Panjang Butterfly Garden (BPBG) and their volunteers continue to be recognised for their efforts in making the garden accessible & inclusive for all.

Butterflies — along with other pollinators including bees, moths, birds, and bats — pollinate over 75% of the world's flowering plants. Gardens like BPBG provide food, shelter, and safety that these winged species need to thrive, in turn strengthening the ecosystem and maintaining life-sustaining biodiversity in nature.

Judged based on three main criteria: 1) garden quality; 2) community engagement & inclusiveness; and 3) biodiversity & sustainability

efforts — the gold award reaffirms BPBG's commitment to improving their horticulture and outreach standards.

In fact, BPBG underwent its own mini metamorphosis in early 2021 to increase the garden's "beauty and functionality" and to blend the past with the present in "complete harmony", according to volunteer Sussie Ketit.

Located at Block 213 Petir Road, the Butterfly Garden welcomes anyone who wants to learn more about these delicate creatures. Their volunteers conduct free guided walking tours (by appointment only), so do come down with your family and friends for an educational day out.



#### 3 Fun Facts about BPBG!

#### **Au Naturel**

BPBG leaves their garden untouched as much as possible, except for some occasional replacement of plants. Allowing the plants to grow fully and freely has contributed to the biodiverse garden they have today.

#### **All-You-Can-Eat**

The garden's "buffet table" concept provides surrounding wildlife with the habitat and food they need. This is accomplished simply by planting few nectar rich cultivars and species of plants in planterbox borders.

#### **Spreading the Love**

BPBG volunteers have helped set up 29 other little gardens corner around Singapore. They also conducted 18 Virtual Garden Tours during COVID-19 and brought the garden to residents instead.
