## **Mozzie Season Alert!**

Dengue, the deadly viral disease that puts an estimated 40% of the world population at risk, is undeniably a cause for concern. The disease has remained endemic in Singapore, with periodic spikes observed in five-to-six year cycles since the 1990s. Infections typically increase from April and peak in July or August, before dipping between September and October. This year, the 5,184 cases reported as of June 15, far exceeded the 2,772 cases reported in 2017 and 3,285 in 2018. Although we are steadily recovering from a dengue outbreak, there is no room for complacency.

Amidst diverse other initiatives, the National Environmental Agency (NEA), in partnership with the Inter-Agency Dengue Task Force and Town Councils, conducted about 609,000 inspections islandwide in the first half of 2022 alone. To supplement national efforts, the Holland-Bukit Panjang Town Council (HBPTC) has been working with pest control teams and our conservancy to safeguard our town and its people.

As we enter the monsoon season, the potential for stagnant water build-up in our estates increases. In light of the current rainy weather, HBPTC has stepped up collaborative efforts with the National Environment Agency (NEA) on pest control and inspection at HDB common areas. We have intensified our pest control treatment from weekly to daily.









## Let's Fight Dengue, **TOGETHER!**

#### **Close Collaboration with NEA**

The NEA, which oversees national initiates and efforts to tackle the dengue outbreak, possesses extensive knowledge on dengue and its risk factors. HBPTC has conducted several meetings and joint inspections in partnership with NEA to detect potential breeding sites in places such as open spaces and HDB lighting conductor pits. These inspections have also helped the Town Council gain a better understanding of the virality of dengue and its risk factors. The insightful collaboration has certainly allowed HBPTC to better its various efforts to safeguard its residents from dengue.



#### **Stepping Up Preventive Efforts**

Whilst our healthcare staff work tirelessly to help those infected, we have been reinforcing our preventive measures. Recognising that prevention is better than cure, we also conduct regular inspections at the rooftop, pump room and HDB common areas, all of which are potential mosquito breeding sites. Clearing of leaves in drains and drain oiling are now a daily affair. Thermal fogging and chemical misting are also carried out with increased frequency. To reap maximal results, we are also planting abates in drainages to deter the formation of mosquito breeding habitats.



















#### **Promoting Ownership in Dengue Prevention**

A strong momentum of community efforts is crucial in our battle against dengue. As such, we seek to promote, amongst our residents, ownership in dengue prevention. We regularly share dengue prevention tips on our Facebook page in addition to showcasing our dengue prevention efforts in digital display panels. To allow our residents to readily remember prevention measures, we created awareness on the "Stop Dengue with B-L-O-C-K" campaign on our digital display panels as well as Facebook page.

#### It's a collective effort!

The fight against dengue remains a collective effort and we encourage residents to take an active role in the matter. At the same time, we are also closely monitoring the dengue situation in our estates and will not hesitate to increase our frequencies of checks when necessary.

## REPURPOSING MRT PARTS IN OUR TOWN

#### **Towards a greener Singapore**

Holland-Bukit Panjang Town Council is proud to play an active role in the campaign to create a sustainable home in Singapore. We have repurposed decommissioned parts from MRT trains in our neighbourhoods, enhancing our residents' living environments while reducing waste to landfill.

As part of PAP's Action for Green Towns (AGT) initiative, which ultimately aims to make every PAPmanaged town zero waste, energy efficient and greener, we are upcycling old MRT seats as benches at some of our void decks. Residents can now rest and connect with one another on these benches while contributing positively to the environment! One happy Zhenghua resident Mr Cedric Tan says "It is nice to see how things can be repurposed in our everyday lives for the good of people. The seats are a nice addition".

#### Our town's role in AGT

The repurposed MRT seats can be found around our town at Block 180 Lompang Road, Block 605 Senja Road, Block 431 Bukit Panjang Ring Road, Block 110 Gangsa Road and Block 532 Jelapang Road.

An old MRT railing has also found a new purpose as a handrail in a male toilet at Block 259 Bukit Panjang Ring Road. This green initiative aims to repurpose at least 1,500 MRT seats as well as 1,400 railings, and we are glad that some upcycled items have found their way into our town, and our lives!

We hope residents will find these seats and handrail beneficial. Have fun (re)using them!







## NATIONAL DAY Celebrations Around Town

After two years of strict COVID-19 measures, our Holland-Bukit Panjang Town was finally able to hold proper celebrations for Singapore's national day — and we did it with a bang! A series of six festive events were held in honour of our nation's 57th birthday.



#### **BUKIT PANJANG** National Day Observance Ceremony & Brisk Walk 2022

Town celebrations started with Bukit Panjang's National Day Observance Ceremony & Brisk Walk 2022 at Bukit Panjang Community Club, which was attended by Mr Liang Eng Hwa. A rousing recital of Singapore's national pledge by students from Zhenghua Primary School kick-started the event, followed by a captivating instrumental performance of our national anthem by the marching band from West Spring Secondary School.

A carnival was also held at Fajar Hills in commemoration of National Day. The festive atmosphere was palpable as residents, decked in red and white, flocked the hilly compound at the heart of the estate for fun and games. There were game stations, such as bowling, ring toss and 'shoot the ducks', as well as a 'potong ice cream' cart, transporting us back to the good old days.
