

About Holland-Bukit Panjang Town Council

Holland-Bukit Panjang Town Council was formed on 13 November 2001 under the Town Councils Act. Local elected representatives and residents are empowered to decide on local estate management matters – determining the identity and character of our town.

The Town Council also manages and maintains the common property of housing estates, including facilities, horticulture and estate improvement works. Approximately 51,999 Housing and Development Board flats and over 1,717 commercial units and stalls are currently under the management of Holland-Bukit Panjang Town Council.

Helmed by Members of Parliament, Holland-Bukit Panjang Town Council covers Holland-Bukit Timah Group Representation Constituency—consisting of Bukit Timah, Cashew, Ulu Pandan and Zhenghua—and Bukit Panjang Single Member Constituency.

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Words from Our MPs



Dear Residents,

Despite the challenging past three years, we have stayed cohesive, compassionate and resilient. Life has now largely returned to normal, and we are glad to see families spending time together and enjoying the amenities in our estates.

We will ensure conservancy works and the town's upkeep continue to be of high standard. We have raised the wages of conservancy workers and cleaners who work tirelessly to keep our estates pleasant and liveable. We hope you will understand the need for the increase in service and conservancy charges (S&CC). Cost of living is an issue on all our minds, and we would like to reassure residents that the government will continue to provide S&CC rebates, ranging from 1.5 to 3.5 months, to defray the cost of living.

A Green Home

Greenery and sustainability are defining features of Holland-Bukit Timah and Bukit Panjang. Over the years, we have been building even more green spaces.

In 2021, Rail Corridor (Central) opened, allowing seamless access from Hillview and Bukit Timah to Rail Corridor (South). Earlier this year, we also opened Rail Corridor (North), which connects our constituency from Upper Bukit Timah all the way to Ghim Moh and further south to Tanjong Pagar.

Last year, we completed the restoration of the nostalgic Bukit Timah Railway Station, which now features amenities such as a cafe, a herb and spice garden, and a heritage gallery. In November 2022, Rifle Range Nature Park was launched, where residents can do birdwatching and explore a quarry among other activities. We hope to make our town greener and more sustainable.

Transport and Connectivity

LRT improvement work is ongoing: new train cabins are being delivered, while the signal and power systems are also being upgraded. We have been liaising closely with the respective agencies and will be providing residents an update within the next six months. With the expanded network of cycling paths and park connectors, our towns are also now better connected. In February, we launched the Cycling Path Network that connects the entire Bukit Panjang Town. This allows residents to access key amenities by cycling on a safe and secure route.

We are also happy to announce that Phase 2 of the Cross Island Line (CRL) will open in 2032. CRL Phase 2 will include Turf City, King Albert Park and Maju MRT stations. There will be better connectivity and shorter travelling times for residents in Bukit Timah and Ulu Pandan to the west and east of Singapore.

New and Upgraded Amenities

In the last three years, residents would have noticed a range of new amenities. In 2021, we opened Bukit Panjang Polyclinic where residents can now access comprehensive healthcare services including chronic disease management, women's and children's health services and dental service. The polyclinic also includes a nursing home and a senior care centre. Last year, we unveiled Senja Hawker Centre, where you can find a wide array of affordable food choices. Residents can also look forward to the NS Hub opening soon which will offer services and activities for everyone.

The Ulu Pandan and Zhenghua Community Clubs (CCs) are currently undergoing upgrading and will reopen with better amenities to serve residents. These will be completed in October 2024 and the first quarter of 2025 respectively. In future, Bukit Timah will have a new integrated development featuring a CC and a redeveloped market and hawker centre at the doorstep of Beauty World MRT station.

Our team is working on various initiatives to make our town better for everyone. We would like to thank our residents for providing many useful suggestions. Many of these initiatives stem from the ideas and concerns that you share with us, and we hope you continue to do so. Let us work together to make Holland-Bukit Timah and Bukit Panjang a better home for all.

打造绿色家园

绿化和可持续发展是荷兰--武吉知马及武吉班让重点关注的事 项。过去两年,铁道走廊中部、南部和北部及射靶场自然公园已 对外开放,武吉知马火车站也完成了翻修。

提升交通和加强衔接性

轻轨系统翻新工程仍持续进行,脚踏车道和公园连道也进一步 扩大,加强了市镇的衔接性。今年2月,新的脚踏车道正式启用, 把整个武吉班让市镇衔接起来。

还有一个好消息,那就是涵盖马城、阿尔柏王园和马裕地铁站的 跨岛线第二阶段,将于2032年启用。到时,沿线的武吉知马和乌 鲁班丹居民将享有更好的交通衔接,缩短往返新加坡西部和东 部的出行时间。

增建和翻新设施

Pengangkutan dan Keterhubungan

Kerja-kerja penambahbaikan LRT sedang dijalankan; bandar kita sekarang lebih terhubung dengan rangkaian laluan berbasikal dan penghubung taman yang diperluas. Pada Februari, kami telah melancarkan Rangkaian Laluan Berbasikal yang menghubungkan seluruh Bandar Bukit Panjang.

Kami juga gembira memaklumkan bahawa Fasa 2 Laluan Rentas Pulau (CRL) akan dibuka pada 2032, termasuk stesen-stesen MRT Turf City, King Albert Park dan Maju. Para penduduk Bukit Timah dan Ulu Pandan akan menikmati keterhubungan yang lebih baik dan masa perjalanan yang lebih singkat untuk ke barat dan timur Singapura.












Holland-Bukit Panjang Town Council | Progress Report 2020-2023





of help from residents via WhatsApp at the height of the pandemic. By leveraging these platforms during a time when we could not gather physically helped to not only maintain but also strengthen our bond and engagement with residents.

A related initiative in Bukit Timah was the creation of a 'green registry' for residents. This involved gathering residents' email addresses and communicating with them electronically. At the same time, we also asked residents whether they preferred to receive hardcopy or digital communications, and the Town Council then adapted the mode of communication with each resident accordingly. This is part of Bukit Timah's digital transformation, which allows us to engage with each other more effectively while also promoting greener practices.

Despite the COVID-19 pandemic, I am glad to have worked with the Town Council to continue delivering much-needed improvements to our estates. Some of the highlights include the sheltered pavilion at Blk 18 Ghim Moh Road which has become a well-loved community space; the sheltered drop-off point at Blk 111 Clementi Street 13; and enhanced connectivity in the Ghim Moh Edge precinct with covered linkways, footpaths, a sheltered barrier-free access ramp and staircase. At the same time, we also carried out repair and redecoration works at Sunset Way and Farrer Gardens, as well as the installation of more solar panels and electric vehicle charging points.

The pandemic pushed us towards new ways of working. Even though we could not conduct house visits and Meet-the-People Sessions (MPS), we continued communicating with residents through other means such as email, social media, phone calls and virtual meetings. In Ulu Pandan, the pandemic also prompted the acceleration of digitalisation to serve our residents better. We digitalised our MPS processes to ensure more rapid responses to appeals, and introduced the Ulu Pandan Community Portal for residents to receive timely news on the neighbourhood and as an additional avenue to provide feedback.















I am looking forward to many more improvement projects in our neighbourhoods. These include a barrier-free access ramp for greater accessibility from Empress Road Market to the nearest bus stop; a sheltered walkway connecting Blks 1–6 Ghim Moh Road to Ulu Pandan Community Club; a paved entry point for Blks 1–6 Ghim Moh Road to the Rail Corridor; and an extensive repair and redecoration project for the entire Ghim Moh Gardens estate, including much anticipated improvements to the beloved Ghim Moh Market and Food Centre.

I hope Ulu Pandan can continue to be a warm, green and welcoming home for all. From our youngest to our most senior residents, my team and I are proud to serve each and every one of you.

Despite the difficulties, we continued to bring about improvements and new developments in Zhenghua. Most recently, we opened Segar Community Hall, which offers a versatile space for community gatherings, events and educational programmes.

In 2021, we unveiled the Pets Park near Blk 550 Segar Road. This dedicated park for pets provides a safe and engaging space for animals and their owners to socialise, exercise and build stronger bonds.

In terms of upcoming developments, residents can look forward to the upgraded Zhenghua Community Club, which will be equipped with a wide array of facilities that cater to diverse interests and age groups. We will also be launching a Senior Care Centre at Blk 645 Senja Close, which will provide daycare for seniors as well as various forms of support for them and their caregivers.

Another exciting project on the horizon is the NParks Park Connector, linking Zhenghua Nature Park with Chestnut Nature Park and Pang Sua Canal. This new cycling network allows residents to exercise amid nature and commute safely using a greener mode of travel.

Looking ahead to the next two years, my vision for Zhenghua is one of growth, unity and shared prosperity. By working collaboratively, we can build upon our community's strengths and create a place where every resident feels valued and engaged. As we move forward, I am excited to see how our collective efforts will shape the future of our town.

What we have done

- The Cash-for-Trash initiative incentivises residents to recycle more by exchanging their recyclables for cash.
- Food rescue programmes reduce waste by collecting food items from supermarkets and other sources to be redistributed to residents.
- The new larger-capacity Bloobins can now hold more recyclables.
- Bukit Paniang is now fully illuminated by LED lighting, 9 years ahead of their 2030 goal.
- 202 blocks were installed with solar panels as of March 2023 to conserve energy.
- Installed more electric vehicles (EV) charging points (up to 24 total) to encourage the switch to EV to reduce carbon emissions.
- Total of 48 community gardens across the 5 divisions including 2 new community gardens in Bukit Panjang.
- More than half of the original 2030 goal of 1,000 trees have been planted.
- Urban farming on the roof of multistorey carparks has beautified landscaping.






In line with our zero-waste vision, the Town Council is committed to further reducing the volume of waste produced in our town, particularly food waste. This is achieved through initiatives such as food rescue programmes as well as continual education to encourage residents to adopt zero-waste habits.

We support infrastructural enhancements that employ clean energy, yet are cost-effective and resource-efficient. Some of these environmentally friendly changes include the installation of LED lights and solar panels around our town.

Holland-Bukit Panjang is known for its abundant greenery. We will continue to protect and enhance our natural environment for all our residents to enjoy. Therefore, we have opened more community gardens, launched the Firefly Park in Clementi, and planted many more trees.

As you have seen in this progress report, the Town Council has much to be proud of. We will continue enhancing our neighbourhoods with new




