Community Hygiene Reminder




Step 1: Store food and clean surfaces

Keep all leftover food in sealed containers or dispose of it properly to prevent pests such as rodents and insects. Wipe down grills and tables after use.



Step 2: Dispose of trash properly

Place all rubbish in designated bins and separate recyclables if available.



Step 3: Report any issues

Inform Town Council if any facility is damaged for prompt maintenance.

Caring for Our Estate Together: Managing Bird Activity

Why It Matters to All of Us

In recent months, there has been an increase in bird activity across the estate, including common areas and residential blocks. Birds are a natural part of our environment; however, excessive bird activity may impact cleanliness, comfort, and safety within shared spaces.

Through collective effort and shared responsibility, we can help maintain a clean, pleasant and welcoming living environment for all residents.

Why are birds gathering in our estate?

The most commonly seen birds in our estate include:



Mynas



Pigeons



Crows

This can happen when:

Food is unintentionally left behind in common areas



Food waste is not disposed of properly

Birds are fed, even with good intentions



Why should we pay attention to this?

When bird activity increases, it may lead to:

- Attraction of other pests such as rats and cockroaches
- Possible health concerns over time
- Unpleasant odours and stains that affect shared spaces

These issues can gradually impact the cleanliness of our living environment.

How we can help...

Every small action makes a difference. Residents can help by:

- Tying and disposing of food waste securely
- Clearing leftover food after using common areas
- Avoiding feeding birds or leaving food behind
- Refraining from throwing food from residential units

When food sources are reduced, birds naturally move on.

A gentle reminder on high-rise feeding

Throwing food from residential units can be dangerous to people below and may also attract birds and other pests.

Under the Environmental Public Health Act, high-rise littering and feeding of birds is an offence and may result in fines of up to:

- \$2,000 for the first offence**
- \$4,000 for the second offence**
- \$10,000 for subsequent offences**
